# Lutheran School 

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The Better Schools Accountability Law of 1985 requires public school districts to report on the performance of their schools and students through school report cards. Cross Lutheran School is not required to publish a School Report Card but provides this information for your interest.

This report card includes information for the 2014-2015 school year about the students, the instructional setting, the finances, and the student performance in Cross Lutheran, the local district, and the state. Income information is limited to those who voluntarily submitted such information. State averages are based on information from regular public schools only.

Generally, elementary schools have grades Kindergarten through eight.
> Cross Lutheran has students from 2-year-old Preschool through eighth grade.
$>$ Parent Conferences are required once a year. There is also an optional conference time later in the year.
$>$ Students live in Yorkville and many surrounding communities.
$>$ Cross Lutheran School is fully accredited by National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA) and hold Illinois State Recognition for Non-Public Schools.

## RACIAL/ETHNIC BACKGROUND AND TOTAL ENROLLMENT

## LOW-INCOME AND LIMITED-ENGLISH-PROFICIENT STUDENTS

Low-Income students come from families receiving public aid; live in institutions for neglected or delinquent children; are supported in foster homes with public funds; or are eligible to receive free or reduced-price lunches.

Limited-English-Proficient students are those who have been found to be eligible for bilingual education.

## ATTENDANCE, MOBILITY AND CHRONIC TRUANCY

A perfect attendance rate (100\%) means that all students attended school every day.
The student mobility rate is based on the number of students who enroll in or leave a school during the school year. Students may be counted more than once.

Chronic truants are students who were absent from school without valid cause for $10 \%$ or more of the last 180 school days.

## AVERAGE CLASS SIZE

Average class size is the total enrollment for a grade divided by the number of classes for that grade reported for the first school day in May. Kindergarten, second grade, and third grade had a teacher's aide in the classroom. The Fifth through Eighth had a shared aide.
